July 19, 2012: Village Board Meeting

July 19, 2012

July 19, 2012 the Village Board Meeting was called to order by Mayor Patrick Kelahan at 7:00 p.m. with the pledge to the flag. Mayor Kelahan welcomed everyone there. In attendance at the Village Board Meeting was Trustee Bernie Leiker, Trustee Jerry Kadryna, the Attorney Jerry Sacca, Ellen Hibbard the Village Clerk Treasurer, Nathan Vanderbeck our Building Inspector, Ann Stimm Deputy Clerk Treasurer and Randy Galyen, Norm Orzel, Jill Rohring from the Planning Board and Donald Sinclair from the Fire Commissioner Board. Mayor Kelahan stated that you will find our minutes posted in various places and on our web-site VillageofWilson.org. Trustee Leiker would like to make a motion of accept the minutes from the last meeting stated from our Clerk-Treasurer and Trustee Kadryna seconded the motion and it was unanimously carried. The bills were accepted as presented at the employees' meeting and copies made for the meeting. Trustee Kadryna made the motion and Trustee Leiker seconded the motion and it was unanimously carried as follows:

Clerk Treasurer, Ellen Hibbard, had nothing at this time.

Trustee Kadryna talked about going to Modern Recycling Center in Buffalo with Trustee Leiker. He was very impressed with what they do at that facility. A discussion followed.

Trustee Leiker wanted to talk about the date August 11, 2012 from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm. Modern will be here to talk about the new recycling carts and a new program that will be put in place. We are encouraging everyone to come out to the Town Hall on August 11, 2012. Discussion followed.

Trustee Bernie Leiker would like to make a resolution to restrict Fracking. Trustee Leiker made the resolution is to ban, storage, transfer, treatment or disposal of natural gas exploration and production of wastes from fracking water. Trustee Kadryna seconded the motion and was unanimously carried. A discussion followed. Trustee Leiker wanted to remind people of Bike Night on August 3, 2012 and Wine Festival on August 4, 2012 in the Village of Wilson.

Attorney Sacca had nothing at this time.

Building Inspector Vanderbeck has gone over the Master Plan Draft and all looks well and we can start looking at zoning and guidelines for the Main Street Grants come in to be more uniform. We generate six building permits last month.

Village Engineer Ryan Smith stated that STC Construction has the lowest bid for the WWTP and they are reputable business and a vast experience in this field and we would benefit from them doing the work. He recommends that we accept their bid for the amount of \$1,149,000.00. The motion was made by Trustee Kadryna to accept the bid from STC Construction for \$1,149,000.00 and Trustee Leiker seconded the motion and was unanimously carried. A discussion followed. See attached the bid acceptance. He also has the sanitation sewer manhole remediation project and will give the guys at the WWTP for their review. Not as expensive and the WWTP improvement and will take year s to finish.

Randy Galyen from the planning board stated we still have to look at the zoning for the CC area and Mayor Kelahan agreed. The variance that was worked on since the last meeting was approved.

Deputy-Clerk Stimm stated we are still on top of the April 2010 storm money from FEMA. We also had Mayor Kelahan received our money from Niagara County Legislator Dave Godfrey, for the brochures that the Town and Village worked on in a joint effort.

Mayor Kelahan asked if there was anything for the good of the Village and Pavel Tynavsky at 137 Ontario Street concerned about loud music and lateness of noise from the Boat House. Like an outdoor concert. Don Sinclair also agreed with Pavel. Norm Orzel, Randy Galyen and Llewellyn Wilson asked questions on the Boat House. A long discussion followed. The Mayor responded with it has not been ignored. And will address it again with owner of the Boat House.

Mayor Kelahan talked about the WWTP Bond Anticipation Notes that will be collected on a sewer district on your taxes on every property and will be transferred and paid out of sewer fund. The amount will be around \$70,000.00 a year that will have to be paid back. The change will be everyone in the Village will be paying the tax even if it is an empty piece of property and also everybody on Sunset Island will be paying their fair share. The Mayor also announced that he was resigning as of the end of the month. He has enjoyed being Mayor for the Village of Wilson. He and his family will be moving on to a neighboring town.

The Village of Wilson Board Meeting was adjourned 8:00 p.m. with a motion from Trustee Kadryna and seconded by Trustee Leiker. It was unanimously carried. The next regular Village Board Meeting will be at the Town Hall on Thursday August 16, 2012 at 7:00 p.m. at the Town Hall.
