Dear Governor Hochul,

We the undersigned 105 organizations urge you to stop the expansion by compression of the aging, over 30-year-old Iroquois natural gas pipeline. The expansion project, if approved, will significantly increase the volume of fracked gas flowing to New York City's National Grid and Consolidated Edison customers. This proposal requires expanding two polluting compressor stations in the Hudson Valley region — in Athens and Dover — and two additional compressor stations along the pipeline's route in Connecticut.

This proposal poses an imminent threat to New Yorkers' health and well-being through increased air pollution and risk of explosions. Compressor stations have a documented history of emitting cancer-causing chemicals, including elevated levels of nitrogen oxide (NOx), fine particulate matter, carbon monoxide, benzene, and formaldehyde. The harmful effects of NOx and particulate matter pollution on respiratory health are well-established, contributing to chronic bronchitis, asthma, emphysema, aggravated heart diseases, difficulty breathing, and reduced life expectancy. New Yorkers have a right to clean air, clean water, and a healthful environment as a result of the Green Amendment (that passed overwhelmingly in 2021) and this proposal would infringe on those rights.

In addition to the danger of the compressor stations, pipelines themselves are historically dangerous. The Iroquois Pipeline, in particular, doesn't have a good track record. In 1996 the Iroquois Pipeline Company was fined by the EPA and US DOJ for violating the clean water act in their destruction of wetlands and streams in the construction of the pipeline. This was the second largest fine in history next to the Exxon Valdez Oil Spill. According to an NRDC report published in 2019, natural gas pipelines led all pipeline infrastructure in injuries, deaths, fires, evacuations, and explosions. In August 2023, the Environmental Defense Fund reported on methane leaks from pipelines and found that U.S. natural gas pipelines are leaking between 1.2 million and 2.6 million tons of methane per year. In 2022, a report from the U.S. PIRG Education Fund, Environment America Research & Policy Center and Frontier Group revealed that 2,600 hazardous gas pipeline leaks in the United States caused more than \$4 billion in damages and emergency services, killed 122 people, and released 26.6 billion cubic feet of fuel as methane or carbon dioxide. Doctors Russo and Carpenter, from the Institute for Health & the

Environment in Rensselaer NY, told the Sierra Club: <u>"In our opinion, the routine emissions surrounding the operation of natural gas compressor stations in New York State (NYS) increase the risk for most major categories of human disease in the state but especially in the communities where they are sited."</u>

The proposal to expand the Iroquois compressors, in addition to being dangerous, is also antithetical to our state's climate goals. Any proposal that would increase fracked gas distribution in New York must be denied for this reason. Producing and distributing fracked gas releases vast amounts of methane — trapping about 86 times more heat in the atmosphere than carbon dioxide within a twenty year time frame. Methane leaks from oil and gas operations are the number-one source of human-caused methane pollution in the country. It's simple: we cannot reach our ambitious emissions reductions goals if we continue to approve projects that will burn more fracked gas.

Governor Hochul, you possess the obligation and the authority to safeguard our environment, our health, and our future. We implore you to deny the expansion of the Iroquois fracked gas pipeline and to champion a brighter, cleaner, and more sustainable future for all New Yorkers.
